KING CITY, Calif.—California Water Service (Cal Water) will complete work on a water infrastructure upgrade next month that will improve water supply reliability and fire protection in King City. The project includes the installation of 1,405 feet of new 8- and 12-inch water main in downtown King City.

Construction, which began in November 2024, is being performed on Broadway Street, from North Mildred Avenue to South San Lorenzo Avenue. Temporary asphalt will be applied until permanent paving is completed, which can be up to 30 days after project completion.
